BARBADOS HAS BECOME A REPUBLIC

The big news in Barbados is that we have become a Republic. Prime Minister the Honourable Mia Amor Mottley had, as part of her manifesto when her party won every seat in parliament in 2018, the aim of ending ties with the monarchy and having a local Head of State. Barbados became independent in 1966 and many locally felt that it was part of the evolution of our independence. Hence Dame Sandra Mason, the former Queen's Representative as Governor General became President of Barbados. Prince Charles was invited to be in attendance and was accorded a 21-gun salute on arrival at the celebrations and a Freedom of Barbados Medal which will replace the Knight of St. Andrew, the highest honour given by the Monarch. Although Barbados has removed the Queen as its head of state, it is has chosen to remain a member of the Commonwealth.

ISLAND DINING

We have some new restaurants to explore - the pretty **Local & Co,** on the beach in historic Speightstown whose ethos is deeply rooted in sustainability and the health of our oceans, soils and local food communities.

Quattro Passi and QP Bistro, located on the former renowned Cliff restaurant site, has undergone extensive refurbishment and offers an exciting dining experience with stunning sea views.

The Round House has a new lease on life with second generation leadership and **Eco-Lodge**, above Bathsheba, has an easy, laidback vibe, serving farm-to-table and sea-to-table dishes on a deck among the palms 100 feet above the coast.

PEG Farm, another product of the burgeoning farm-to-table scene, offers superb burgers on an inland deck with a vast view. Another simple local stop is **Dina's**, a lilac and fuchsia shack right above the Atlantic rollers, where Dina offers popular local dishes such as fresh fish, chicken, macaroni pie and roasted breadfruit.

Locals and visitors alike still enjoy Holetown favourites, **The Mews, Nishi** and **Fusion Rooftop** in Limegrove, and **Sea Shed** and **La Cabane** are as popular as ever with their simple and stylish beach bars, made for lingering all day and evening.









ISLAND ATTRACTIONS

Andromeda is a 6-acre botanical garden and historic cultural attraction in the village of Bathsheba. All the botanical gardens on island had lots of tender loving care over the quiet COVID period and are in peak condition for visitors. **Tropical Garden** meanders along winding paths and slopes filled with orchids and tropical plants and **Hunte's Gardens**, set in a limestone sinkhole, is a flamboyant affair, a cauldron of colour and blooms with classical music playing.

In the east, a noisier, more frenetic experience is on offer for motor-racing fans at the **Bushy Park Circuit**. The birthplace of Barbados' star driver, 18-year-old Zane Maloney, winner of Formula 4 in 2019 who is currently riding high in the Formula Regional European Championship. You can ride around the track on which he honed his skills as a passenger in a Formula 4 racing car, a Radical FR3 or book go karting experiences for children from 5 - 18 years.

Bajans claim Barbados is the original home of rum. In the north, Mount Gay, who have been making rum since 1703, has recently opened a full distillery tour. The beautifully restored **St. Nicholas Abbey Great House Plantation and Distillery**, built in 1660, is one of only two Jacobean structures on the island and one of only three in the entire Western Hemisphere. The Heritage Railway on the site is a new and exciting family attraction.

Some of our guests love to explore the island while others prefer to simply relax at the hotel where their decision making is little more than deciding what to order for lunch whilst gazing out to sea!
